What is the Knights of Columbus?

The Knights of Columbus is a fraternal organization of Catholic Men, 18 years of age an older. It was founded in 1882, and today is an international society of more than 1.6 million men in nearly 12,000 council units. Members of the Order are found in the USA, Canada, Mexico, the Philippines, Puerto Rico, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, the Bahamas, the Virgin Islands, Guatemala, Guam and Saipan.

The State of Pennsylvania contains over 65,000 Knights corresponding to some 455 councils.

The Knights of Columbus is founded on the four ideals of Columbianism: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. Internationally, the Organization generates over \$130 million and 60 million volunteer hours for charitable causes each year.

Local councils are every connected to their corresponding Catholic Parishes and the surrounding community.

Personal commitment and direct involvement by the Knights of Columbus are the aims and purposes of the "Surge..... with Service" program which concentrates on five basic areas of involvement: Church, Community, Family, Youth, and Fraternity!

Over the past three fiscal years, our council has won 14 Awards for Excellence in raising funds for this cause.

Our main sources of fund-raising were the Fathers' Day Collection at all our parishes, when we ask our members and their family to collect outside the churches. (This is a task that is Easy to Do, and Very Rewarding!)

Gently-Used Children's Books
For Pre-Schoolers & K-8th Poor Children

Originated in our council four years ago, this award winning program has been expanded throughout the State and into other states. It consists of collecting books at churches, checking them, and distributing them to Food Pantries, Child Care Centers, and Poor Elem. Schools. We stress "Reading to Pre-Schoolers"

EECM - Advent Food Drive

Originated in 2001, this project consists of members pledging some amount (\$1.00, \$2.00, \$0.50, Etc) for the 28 days of Advent. The funds are used to purchase non-perishable foods at large discounts and donating them to the EECM (East End Community Ministry) Food Pantry and Kitchens. To date, 9,700 lbs of foods with a value of \$18,000 have been donated!
